To Whom It May Concern:

Re: K+S Pipe Modules

In July 2013, K+S Potash Canada Ltd (KSPC) contracted Saskarc Industries Inc. (Saskarc) to supply two Wellfield Pad Modules for the Legacy Mine near Bethune, SK. The scope of this contract included installation of the modules on the basement foundations on site using a jack and slide method.

Saskarc provided a turn-key package including connection design, detailing, supply, fabrication, painting, assembly and testing of the structural steel as well as supply, fabrication, painting, insulating, testing and installation of pipe spools. Saskarc also installed free issued valves provided by KSPC, provided transportation and fully installed the modules on site. The modules were assembled in Saskarc's module yard in Oxbow, SK and were 100' long, 30' wide, 12' tall and weighed 227,000 lbs.

Through the entire project, Saskarc maintained the highest level of documentation and quality, and provided on time delivery. Their dedicated project management team was very professional and committed to working as a team with AMEC/KSPC and other contractors to ensure the successful completion of this project.

Upon successful completion of the first two pipe modules, Saskarc was awarded a further two pipe modules in February 2014 which were also successfully completed on time.

AMEC recommends Saskarc for any large fabrication projects, including projects that involve multiple subcontractors, complex scopes, field installation and challenging schedules.
